


Curriculum Aims

This document sets our curriculum aims which supports and underpins everyday practice.

At 'Avon small saints' Pre School our curriculum is focused and centred around the individual child. We aim to embrace the interests of the children and be responsive to their curiosity and thinking. Our free flow indoor/outdoor approach and natural and calming style environment allows children the freedom to make choices and be an advocate of their own learning.

We hold high value towards the natural environment, this reflects within the ethos of our setting and has been a key factor in the development of our curriculum. Children are given the opportunity to explore, appreciate and understand the natural world, take & manage risks and ultimately develop a love for the outdoors. All children have access to an on-site enclosed garden where they can have lots of learning opportunities to explore the environment. The children also have the opportunity to explore the local community with visits to the park and church and local village library.

Practitioners are facilitators to children's learning their role is to offer meaningful opportunities and experiences whilst listening to the child and tuning in to their needs and interests.





Avon Small Saints Curriculum 2023/24










Our Mission Statement

Reggio Emilia

One of the approaches is that of the world-renowned early years educational project from the city of Reggio Emilia in Northern Italy. In Reggio Emilia the image of child is that of competent, strong and amazing individuals who have rights and responsibilities, children are also given the opportunities to realise their potential.

Children are encouraged to express themselves in a variety of ways, referred to as The Hundred Languages.

"For us, each child is unique and the protagonist of his or her own growth. We also note that children desire to acquire knowledge, have much capacity for curiosity and amazement, and yearn to create relationships with others and to communicate" Tiziana Filippini, Reggio Emilia





In the moment

Another approach which has had a significant impact on influencing our practice is that of Anna Ephgrave and her in the moment approach to teaching and learning.

An in the moment approach has been carefully researched and embedded into our practice for several years, this style of planning supports the EYFS 2021 cycle of observation, assessment & planning, however it is carried out on a moment-by-moment basis. Progress, development, interests and experiences are recorded and reflected upon after they have happened.

reconstruction of their own learning" Anna Ephgrave 2020






The Early Years foundation stage






'Your physical potential is limitless'




'An appreciation of your senses'
